He is an LSF court interpreter in France and also interprets between LSF and International Sign Language at world conferences. He is an experienced actor and comedian and has performed in numerous theatrical pieces, films and videos, including productions by International Visual Theatre (IVT) and WebSourd. He has created and directed original theatrical performances in LSF and International Sign Language and has worked with internationally known Deaf actors and directors, including Alfredo Corrado, Emmanuelle Laborit and Jacques Sangla. Bruno is also widely known in France for his community activism and production of informational videos of great significance to Deaf people. He has studied Theatre, Pedagogy, Linguistics, History of Deaf People and Teaching of Signed Languages. Bruno is an animated, dynamic and genuinely imaginative personality who is sure to educate and entertain the participants of this workshop.
